- 'Scientific names far more often written than spoken'

- All vowels are short
e.g. Calliostoma, Calus, Glycymeris, Modiolus.
- First syllable long, the rest short
e.g. Liamesus
- First and second syllables long
e.g. Salen
- Second syllable long, the rest short
e.g. Trophon
